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BEYOND 125 CAMPAIGN DONOR WALL


The Donor Wall stands as a testament to the generosity of our community and acknowledges those who have given to the ongoing Beyond 125 Campaign, since it launched in 2019.

PROGRAMME IN FOCUS - ST JOHN'S PREP ACADEMY

The St John's Prep Academy serves boys in Grade 6 and 7 from Asteri, Yeoville Community College and Yeoville Boys Primary School. This year, students have attended St John's four days a week for supplementary teaching and extracurricular activities. Offering enrichment lessons in English and Mathematics, the core academic programme is held on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday afternoons. Boys attend on a fourth afternoon to take part in a range of sporting and cultural activities. St John's College builds men rightly trained in body, mind and character and the students of the Prep Academy continue to thrive in an environment that brings support, consistency and structure - so critical to childhood development.

We aim to provide a holistic experience that acknowledges the individual child and prioritizes academic progress and results, paving the way for better high school opportunities.

This year, in addition to an academic programme, the Prep Academy offered swimming, soccer, art, athletics, strength & conditioning, cricket, tag rugby and hockey skills and chess. Asteri Primary School participated in the Phendulani Literacy Quiz at Roedean School, where they excelled. The Academy boys also visited Masibambane in Orange Farm to participate in sporting tournaments and to broaden their social base.

We congratulate our Class of 2024, and graduating boys will be attending neighbouring schools within our community such as KES, Athlone Boys, Parktown Boys, Highlands North and Barnato. We aim to keep in touch with their parents and the boys and where possible, invite students to return to the College Academy in grade 10.






ST JOHN'S COLLEGE TEACHER INTERNSHIP PROGRAMME

Our teacher internship programme offers an environment which ensures that prospective teachers are afforded unparalleled experience as they train to become educators. The St John's Foundation, through donor contributions, supports the interns on various levels, including university fees, stipends, books, accommodation, and most importantly, relevant and practical teaching experience.

The intention of this project is to shape confident, inspired and inspiring teachers who will pass the gift of quality education on to future generations. A single teacher touches the lives of many, and the effect is exponential. To recruit prospective teacher interns, we work closely with Wits University to secure passionate and dedicated young adults, who are studying their Post-Graduate Certificate in Education (PGCE). This adds significantly to their practical teaching experience as they study, and enables St John's to give back to the educational sector while contributing to the growth and development of excellence in educators.
