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# ADVANCEMENT AT ST JOHN'S COLLEGE

Advancement is the process of raising support, financial and otherwise, from core community stakeholders and aligning external partnerships to *advance* institutional plans and projects.

The newly established Advancement Office is dedicated to promoting the strategic development of St John's College by uniting the efforts of all within the St John's community. Our goal is to cultivate and encourage meaningful connections within our school's immediate community and beyond, including staff, students, parents, Old Johannians, past parents and donors.

The St John's business model is for the current fees to cover the school's running costs. For St John's College to remain on the cutting edge of education in South Africa, it will need to draw on alternative streams of income and the support of the broader St John's community.

The Advancement Office is a link between the school and our external stakeholders. As a central point of contact between the various role-players, we break down silos to bring alignment and direct the whole community's efforts to advance the school's strategic imperatives.

# The School

We work closely with school leadership to develop plans and projects that will support St John's College in achieving its long-term objectives. These plans are shared with the broader community to create awareness and garner support. They include Capital Projects, Projects, Student Support, Community Engagement and Sustainability.

We work closely with other departments in the school, all of which play a critical role in our Advancement activities, including Marketing and Communications, Transformation and Community Engagement, Archives and Events.

Furthermore, St John's College has a range of robust volunteer structures that provide valuable support to the Advancement Office and help implement the strategic vision of the College. There is a quarterly Advancement Forum that ensures the co-ordination of these vital volunteer groups.

# The Foundation - Development and Fundraising

Development and Fundraising are important elements of Advancement, and the proceeds of all efforts and campaigns are directed to the St John's College Foundation. The role of the Foundation is to safeguard all donor contributions through responsible investment and ensure that all donor funding is used for the purpose of the donation. The Foundation is governed by an independent board of trustees and chaired by Steve Raney (OJ Nash 1974).

The Advancement Office is the active fundraising arm for the school and is responsible for:

- project management, proposal development and campaign co-ordination
- prospect and project research
- database and donor administration
- donor communications
- stewardship and reporting
- stakeholder engagement
- events for donor stewardship and fundraising

We also work closely with the St John's UK and USA Foundations, ensuring collaboration and co-ordination across countries and continents.

# The Old Johannian Association

The Advancement Office works closely with the Old Johannian Association, the first port of call for Old Johannians to reconnect with the school and each other. We provide support in various ways to ensure that their relationship with St John's College remains a relationship for life. This includes assisting with reunions, communications, events, archives, database management and class giving.

We have recently taken significant steps to update relevant information to improve communications and ensure regulatory compliance within the Old Johannian network. With many Old Johannians living in other cities and abroad, staying connected is a priority. The Advancement Office is committed to supporting the Old Johannian Association in maintaining strong, vibrant relations with its community.

The Advancement Office works with the Old Johannian Association and class champions to promote, co-ordinate and administer class-giving programmes. Class-giving initiatives demonstrate just how powerful a collective can be and anchor the long-lived philosophy of moving forward: giving back and making a difference. A recent class-giving project has enabled a funded Centenary Scholar to matriculate from St John's. We proudly send a straight-A student, prefect and top sportsman to pursue his tertiary studies at the end of this year.

# The Parents' Association

We work with the Parents' Association to facilitate a co-ordinated approach in fundraising activities and community engagement between parents and the school. Parents are at the heart of our community and contribute enormously to the school's success in every way, both in fundraising and volunteer work. The Advancement Office assists the PA with the administrative back-end of fundraising and donor stewardship and supports the front end of communications and events.

### **Community Engagement and Student Support**

St John's College is committed to authentic engagement with neighbouring communities, navigating the contradiction that is Johannesburg, and building bridges to provide sustainable opportunities and partnership where we can. Access to education and resources uplifts in exponential ways.

The St John's College Academy and Centenary Scholarship Programmes are our core community engagement initiatives. The Academy, in partnership with neighbouring inner-city schools, provides enrichment in core subjects and a range of other initiatives that build confidence, leadership and resilience in the boys three days a week. Under the leadership of the new Head of Community Engagement, Mickey Mashego, the Academy is broadening its scope to include sports and cultural activities.

The Centenary Scholarship Programme, introduced in 1998 to mark the School's 100th anniversary, offers academic and boarding scholarships to 10 deserving boys per form in the College. The Advancement Office works closely with Allan Magubane, Deputy Headmaster: Transformation and Community Engagement, and Mickey Mashego on this programme.

### Heritage and Archives

At St John's College, heritage is our foundation. We honour our rich history while continuing to evolve, progress and write new narratives. In some way, each community member is a custodian and every student who has walked these halls is part of the school's story. The school maintains a detailed archive of images, memorabilia and artefacts. The Advancement team is actively engaged with our history as members of the Heritage Committee and often call on the Archives department for rich material to share with Old Johannians and parents.

# The Peter Drummond Scholarship

# - a gift to St John's College in honour of its 125th birthday

St John's College is delighted to announce the establishment of **The Peter Drummond Scholarship**, a gift to St John's in recognition of the College's 125th birthday in 2023. Peter Drummond, whose generous donation has made the scholarship possible, is an esteemed Old Johannian who attended St John's College from 1952 until he matriculated from Thomson House in 1962.

"Mr Drummond's donation is a moving tribute to his years spent at St John's and a true vote of confidence in the school and its future direction," says Shelley Roberts, Head of Advancement. "This generous gift will give a deserving young man the chance to reach his full potential and, like Mr Drummond himself, make a positive difference in the world by paying it forward."

The donation is to be invested by the St John's College Foundation with the return generated used to cover the Scholarship. Any residual dividends will be transferred to the College endowment fund.

The Peter Drummond Scholarship will be awarded annually to a boy entering Remove at St John's College and covers **60% of the annual College tuition fees**. An additional R10 000 per student per year will be available to support any extra tutoring in a chosen area of interest, whether it be an academic, sporting, musical or cultural pursuit.



The Peter Drummond Scholarship recipient will be a student who promises to make an all-round contribution to St John's College. He will acknowledge and support the ethos and heritage of the College as expressed in the school prayer. He will be a young man of sound academic record with an average consistently above 75% who has also demonstrated strong leadership potential.

A Peter Drummond Scholar will have represented his Prep or Primary School at first-team level in at least two sports. In the College, he will embody the ethos of an education "rightly trained in body, mind and character", achieving consistently well academically while contributing to the sporting and cultural life of the College. Lastly, he will commit to mentoring younger Johannians in his senior years.

The first Peter Drummond Scholarship will be awarded in 2023.

"The Peter Drummond Scholarship is a gift from a successful Old Johannian to St John's College in recognition of our pending 125th birthday. Many great schools rely on the support of their alumni to remain sustainable. Financial assistance is needed for many reasons, none more pressing than helping deserving young men to attend St John's. Mr Drummond's generous donation of a scholarship to support a talented young Johannian speaks to his philanthropic character, an appreciation of what St John's did for him, and a vision of creating these opportunities for future generations. It is an example for Old Johannians worldwide to follow as we look to celebrate our past and create a future forged by Johannians rightly trained in body, mind and character."

# Paying it Forward with Class Giving

*'Good Heart, Bad Diaries'* is the name given to the bursary initiative spearheaded by the Class of 2004, a peer-led collective driven by Ronak Gopaldas (OJ Thomson 2004) and Matthew Thomson (OJ Hill 2004).

Despite their busy schedules, the Old Johannians from this year group came together in 2017 to give back by creating an opportunity for a promising young Centenary Scholar. Their thinking was based on the principle that consistent contributions from many add up, and all Old Johannians from the year were encouraged to make an annual pledge.

The initiative committed to offering more than a financial contribution, but also providing holistic support that included mentoring and engagement. "We wanted to offer a high-potential learner the ability to achieve and not be constrained by factors beyond their control," said Ronak.

The first recipient of the 'Good Hearts, Bad Diaries' five-year bursary funded by the Class of 2004 is currently in his matric year at St John's and plans to study law next year.

"Given the huge privileges and opportunities we have been afforded in life, this is just a small effort to pay it forward and do something meaningful in our deeply unequal society. Hopefully, our efforts will leave a lasting and tangible impact," says Ronak.

The concept is powerful, and we look forward to working with Old Johannian class groups across the years to give back and bring positive change to the lives of deserving young men.

# **Academy Assistance**

# The St John's College MySchoolCard Campaign

There are 1613 students enrolled at St John's College. We currently have only 740 parents and family members signed up for the programme. Thanks to these participants, we earn an average of R19 000 a month for our community engagement programmes. In 2020, the MySchoolCard programme contributed a total of R226 500 to the School.

We would like everyone in our community to join the St John's College MySchoolCard programme. We hope to have at least 1000 parents subscribed by the end of this year and double this number by the end of 2022.
