

There is no doubt that Easter Term 2024 has been very busy. It has been filled with ups and downs, successes and some sadnesses.


The overwhelming tone of the term, however, has been a celebration of our students and their remarkable accomplishments.

On Monday 5 February, we toasted to our Academy Class of 2023, who managed to amass 12 distinctions and 29 B symbols among the 22 students who wrote the matric examinations.

The St John's College Academy, an after-school enrichment programme offering supplementary teaching to promising young men, is a partnership between St John's College, Barnato Park and Highlands North Boys' High. The Academy students join us on campus from Grade 10 to 12 in the afternoons for extension lessons as well as extra-curricular activities.

Daniel Mboyo and Abraham Kazadi Mathematics and Geography. He who both achieved a distinction in Mathematics and Geography. Daniel narrowly missed a further two distinctions, with 79% for Life Sciences and Physical Sciences, and Abraham achieved 78% for Further Studies Mathematics. Tendai Kwapata achieved two distinctions in Business Studies and isiZulu and pulled off a 100% attendance record during his three years at the Academy, never missing a day of school. He was also the Academy Soccer Captain during his matric

appearances that leave the audience speechless, and this year's edition was no different.



MASTERCLASSES IN MUSIC

n Friday, 16 February, the Music Department hosted two internationally acclaimed musicians who presented masterclasses to our College musicians.

Prof Norbert Salvenmoser, acclaimed professor in trombone and didactics at the Mozarteum University in Salzburg and director of the Musikschule Wattens in the Tyrol, presented a brass masterclass to Daniel Teeling Smith (LV Nash), Liam Batley (LV Clayton) and

Jason Aspoas (LV Clarke) with all of our senior College brass players attending as spectators. He gave them valuable advice on how to enhance the expressive aspects of their playing, and his main focus points were centred around good breathing and breath support, producing a smoother, more sensitive articulation and how good posture supports sound production and overall musical expression. All three participants were reminded about how

important it is to have a relaxed, upright posture and to bring the instrument to them rather than contorting their necks/shoulders to accommodate the instrument. Two Austrian colleagues accompanied Prof Salvenmoser, and together, they demonstrated the baroque trombones (modern-day copies of 16th-century instruments) and gave a short performance and a mini-lecture and the performance practice associated with these instruments. *Read more*



2024 Junior African Fencing Championships


