
The Victory Bell rang in celebration of the 1st XI Cricket, Water Polo, and Basketball teams' victories in the summer derbies against King Edward VII School.

DONOR WALL UNVEILING






LEST WE FORGET



BASKETBALL

The final basketball weekend of 2024 saw an eagerly anticipated derby against friendly rivals King Edward VII School on Saturday 2 November. Across 19 games, St John's teams showcased exceptional talent, with the 1st team securing a 64-54 victory. Highlights included a 48-32 win for the U15A team, while the U14A narrowly lost 26-32. Other teams, including the 4ths, U15C, and U14B-E squads, delivered commendable performances.

At the Inanda Hoops Classic Challenge (24-27 October), hosted by St David's Marist Inanda, the 1st team clinched silver after a closely contested 25-35 final against St Stithians College. Captain Kuda Tebeila (LV Hill) was named Assist Leader of the tournament, and vice-captain Yanda Peter (LV Clayton) earned a spot on the All-Star team. The U15A team showed great determination, reaching the quarterfinals but narrowly losing 51-54 to Saints, finishing 8th overall.

The U14A team triumphed at the AISJ Basketball Tournament (25-26 October), winning every game and securing the title. In a thrilling final, Leano Leepile (Remove Nash) hit a decisive 3-pointer in the last five seconds, sealing a 19-17 victory over Maru-a-Pula of Botswana.

Mpendulo Buthelezi (Remove Alston) was named MVP of the tournament.

David Tirkaso (LV Thomson) was honoured as an All-Star at the Inaugural Basket National League School Challenge on 20 October for his outstanding performance.

Earlier in the season, the 1st team impressed at the Kearsney College Stayers Basketball Tournament (27-29 September), advancing unbeaten in the group stage but narrowly losing 36-39 to ESCA Wanderers in the quarterfinals, finishing 6th overall. At the U15 Northwood School Tournament in Durban (27-28 September), the U15As demonstrated strong growth, reaching the quarterfinals before a close 31-37 loss to St David's Marist Inanda.

On 12 October, St John's travelled to St Alban's College in Pretoria for a packed day of 12 games. The 1st team narrowly lost 45-44 in a tense encounter, while the U15A and U14A teams secured impressive wins. St John's celebrated 8 victories, with the U14A and D teams achieving a clean sweep.

A remarkable end to the season, showcasing skill, teamwork, and the enduring spirit of St John's basketball.



FOOTBALL

The football season began on 16 July, with our U16A and U15 mixed teams facing the Piggott School from the UK. Both teams narrowly lost, 0-1 and 3-4, respectively. The following fixtures against St Benedict's College saw the 1st XI secure a 2-1 victory, with the U16B and U14A teams also claiming wins.

On 27 July, we faced CBC Boksburg. Despite the 1st XI taking an early lead, they ultimately lost 3-1. However, the 2nd XI put in an outstanding performance, winning 6-0, while the U15B and U14B teams also triumphed. The U16A team drew 3-3 in a thrilling match.

The team then travelled to Parktown Boys' High School on 3 August. The 1st XI bounced back with a last-minute 2-1 win. There were also victories for the 2nd XI, U16B, and U15B teams, while the U16A and U15A teams played to 1-1

The season concluded on 28 September with a match against St Alban's College. The 1st XI fought hard but lost 2-1, despite a late surge that saw the ball strike the post three times. The U16A and U15A teams drew 1-1 and 2-2, while the U14A team lost 4-0.



CRICKET

October saw an exciting and competitive summer sports season get underway. On Wednesday, 2 October, our 3rd XI, U15B, and U14B cricketers claimed victories in midweek action against St Stithians, setting the tone for an actionpacked weekend ahead. On Saturday, 5 October, our First XI faced our friendly rivals at Saints, where the game went down to the wire, with the hosts clinching a nail-biting 2-wicket victory off the last ball. 

St John's College announces with great sadness the passing of our oldest Old Johannian.

John David (Jack) Hadfield passed away early on Tuesday morning, 5 November 2024, eighty years after he had matriculated from the College.

Jack Hadfield was at school during the tough World War II years when South African society became aware of social problems in Johannesburg and the rest of the country.

After Trevor Huddleston visited St John's and addressed the boys, Jack heard the CR priest's call for help. Together with three other boys, he took over teaching at the 'Native Night School', teaching English and Mathematics. Jack Hadfield was the last surviving member of this 1940s venture, which provided education for township boys who were unable to attend school. *Read more...*
