REMEMBRANCE DAY

he College Remembrance Day Mass took place on Thursday, 9 November 2023, where students, staff and Old Johannians gathered in The Memorial Chapel to honour the profound sacrifices made in wars past and present.

In 1918, the eleventh hour marked the end of the First World War, inspiring the creation of the Memorial Chapel at St John's College in 1926. We remembered the 158 OJs and staff who lost their lives in both World Wars, their names etched in the panels of the All Souls' Chapel during the mass, and we reflected on the devastating toll of war, which lasted over four years in WWI and six years in WWII, and acknowledged the unspeakable loss and suffering experienced globally.

In 1994, Remembrance Day took on new significance for our democratic South Africa, honouring those who fought for freedom in the World Wars and the struggle for democracy.

As a Johannian Community, we laid our beautiful St John's roses at the altar and stood united, paying the deepest respect to all who made the ultimate sacrifice for peace, freedom, and justice.



HABITS OF THE HEART II

he Archbishop Emeritus Desmond Tutu Walk was held on Saturday, 7 October 2023, on what would have been the late Arch's 92nd birthday. The young men and women of the St John's and Roedean Academies, parents, and members of the greater Houghton, Hillbrow, Berea, Yeoville and the greater Johannian community came together for a pilgrimage to reflect and connect with the people and spaces around them.

The 5km route took the party through Roedean School, to Asteri Primary School, Barnato Park High School, St Aidan's Anglican Church and King Edward VII School before arriving back at St John's College for a final reflection in Tutu Quad and a picnic on D Field.

At each station, representatives from each destination welcomed and offered participants their perspectives on the city, education, and the inequality confronted along the walk. This was enhanced by guided reflections, Bible readings and prayers at each station.

Participants were left feeling disquieted by the challenges facing our neighbouring precinct but were also made hopeful by the conversations had along the way, by the potential to connect more meaningfully in future, and by the spirit of Ubuntu that was felt by all. We are proud of this annual event that has been born.

The 2nd Archbishop Emeritus
Tutu Memorial Mass & Lecture
held in The Memorial Chapel
on Sunday, 8 October 2023, was
a profound event presided over
by College Chaplains The Revd
Fr Thapelo Masemola and The
Revd Dr Jeremy Jacobs, with
apologies from The Visitor, The
Right Revd Dr Steve Moreo,
Bishop of Johannesburg, who was
unfortunately not able to join us.

The morning's highlight was a compelling lecture and sermon delivered by The Revd Frank Chikane, an inspirational leader, teacher, motivator, mentor, counsellor, and struggle hero who has made significant contributions across various sectors.

In his thought-provoking address, The Revd Chikane spoke of Desmond Tutu as a special creation of God, with a larger-than-life commission during a crucial time in history. He emphasised the importance of truth-telling, drawing from the prophetic tradition exemplified by the Arch. He delved into the formative elements that shaped Archbishop Tutu and the unjust conditions that drove him to raise his voice for the oppressed, the poor, and the suffering.

The Revd Chikane quoted John Stuart Mill: "Bad [people] need nothing more to compass their ends than that good [people] should look on and do nothing." He passionately positioned these words as a challenge to the entire community, urging them to take action and never remain silent in the pursuit of justice for their country.

WITS MATHS COMPETITION

t John's College shone in the Wits Maths Competition, which included teams from all over South Africa and a growing cohort of international schools, with over 11 000 entries this year on 31 October 2023.

The event was back on the Wits campus this year for local schools, where the students enjoyed the impressive facilities in the Science Stadium.

The Junior Team came first in the competition, regaining their crown, having won five of the six years it has been running. Xiaoyuan Li (Remove Alston) achieved 9th overall and 3rd in Gauteng. Jason Shi (Remove Alston) placed 4th in Gauteng, while Zhirui Li (Remove Hill) also placed in the top 10 in Gauteng. A remarkably large number of 19 juniors qualified to write the second round.

The Senior Team ranked top in South Africa and second overall, with an international school placing first. The Senior Team remains undefeated in South Africa after six years, a remarkable achievement, considering the growth of the competition.

Noah Jacobsen (LVI Runge) achieved 10th overall and 3rd in Gauteng. He also won the



prize for the best proofs in Gauteng. Angus Clark (UV Thomson) finished 4th in Gauteng. They were two of the 16 St John's College students who qualified for the second round and made up the largest school team in the second round.

The winners' medals have been named after Wits alumni and retired professors who have contributed significantly to mathematics, and our very own Old Johannian Prof James Ridley (Nash 1958/Sixth Form 1959) was on that list. The history, present, and future of mathematics at St John's shines brightly.



Edwards quizzed him about his writing process, inspiration and themes and opened the floor to questions about the book and characters. Copies of his book are available to purchase in The School






