Dear St John's College Community,



Mrs Fiona Kampmann and her team launched a series of events for the College




JAYDEN HOSKINS JOINS THE CGGI CLASS OF 2024

Derby Days

The winter sports season kick-started with matches against our longstanding friends, Saint Andrew's School Bloemfontein, from 10 to 11 May. We hosted the boys from Mangaung for a weekend celebrating 91 years of camaraderie, filled with sporting and cultural activities. The hockey 1st XI drew 0-0, while the U16A team won 4-1 against Saint Andrew's and 2-0 against Hoërskool

On Saturday, 25 May 2024, we faced Jeppe High School for Boys. The rugby 1st XV lost 67-30, and the U16A, U15A, and U14A teams also faced challenges. The 5th team lost 10-5. The hockey 1st XI drew 2-2, the U15C won, and the U15B drew 1-1 against Jeppe's U16Ds.

We then travelled to Tshwane for matches against Pretoria Boys High School on Saturday, 1 June. The 1st XV lost 36-24, the U16A lost 27-24, and the U15A and U14A teams lost. The hockey 1st XI won 1-0, and the U16C, U15C, U15D, U16D, and U14B

teams all won. The U16A, U16B, and U15B teams drew, and the U14A team lost 2-1.

A week later, on 8 June, we competed against St Benedict's College and Springs Boys' High School. The hockey 1st XI drew 1-1, the 2nd XI drew 0-0, the U16A and U14A teams won, and the U15A team drew 0-0. In rugby, the 1st XV won 54-0, the 2nd XV and 4th XV won, the U15A and U15B teams won, the U14B team won 17-10, the U16A lost 17-14, and the U14A lost 20-10.

On Saturday, 15 June, the season concluded with matches against St Alban's College in Pretoria. Arena from 1 to 5 July. Yanda and the U18 Gauteng team triumphed over KwaZulu-Natal in the final to be crowned champions.


Nathan Tshwatswa plays for the Zimbabwean U18 Basketball team






