


The reality is that school education in South Africa continues to face significant historic challenges. These include significant disparities in educational opportunities, delivery and outcomes, a growing shortage of qualified teachers entering the sector, and the challenges faced by teachers of overcrowded classrooms, a lack of resources, inadequate infrastructure, and a dropout rate of nearly 50% from Grade 0 to Matric. This educational malaise perpetuates a cycle of poverty and marginalisation, with limited opportunities to ensure a young person's future success.

As a top-performing independent school, St John's College is well-positioned, both in our resources, educational experience and geographical location to address these issues and make a positive impact on the lives of its students. The school has the expertise and infrastructure to provide a high-quality educational environment, including well-equipped classrooms, experienced teachers, and a wide range of extracurricular activities.

A key way that St John's College is addressing these challenges is through its commitment to providing scholarships and academic support to talented students from disadvantaged backgrounds; building partnerships with our neighbouring community through impactful community engagement initiatives; and developing excellent teachers to contribute to the future of St John's and the rest of the country through our Teacher Internship Programme.

Providing these programmes and maintaining and developing the magnificent buildings and facilities that make them possible, requires significant endowment and strategic funding. That is why St John's College places a strong emphasis on future fundraising and the work of the Advancement Office and the St John's College Foundation. It is no secret that we rely on the generosity of our community partnerships, St John's families and Old Johannians to help us provide the resources and opportunities our students and emerging teachers need to succeed. Whether it is through donations, sponsorships, or other forms of support, every contribution makes a real difference to the impact St John's can make in its community, its city and South Africa.

MESSAGE FROM THULANI KHANYILE, HEAD OF COUNCIL

From its humble provenance in August 1898 as part of St Mary's Parish in a villa on Plein Street in a city founded a mere 12 years earlier, to its closure in May 1900 when many fled the Transvaal during the South African War, to its rebirth in April 1901 in a corrugated-iron structure in King George Street in downtown Joburg, and to its massive development under the stewardship of the Anglican Holy Order, the Community of the Resurrection, the early years of St John's College were a testament to faith, service, pertinacity and resilience. Facing threats such as war and better-resourced state schools funded by the colonial government, the pioneers held fast to their vision of a venture of faith that would produce students rightly trained in "body, mind and character." Now famous for the beautiful architecture of Herbert Baker and Frank Fleming, St John's College has indeed come a long way. But as we look out from the top of the amphitheatre to Burger Field and into the vistas beyond, we are indeed conscious of our humble beginnings, the great milestones achieved, the generations of staff, students, governors, volunteers and donors who toiled to build the school and we are mindful of the new peaks that we will need to scale in the future to build a St John's that is future-fit and rightly belongs to the wider community. This work is never done, and we are grateful and honoured to number amongst the stewards of this educational institution of the first rank.

Every generation faces problems that seem, at the time, insurmountable: political instability, inequality, disease, poverty, environmental calamity and more. This generation is no different, except that the scale of these problems has reached unprecedented levels of complexity and severity. Our founding President of a democratic South Africa, Mr Nelson Rolihlahla Mandela, reminds us that "It always seems impossible until it's done."

In South Africa, we bear witness to growing inequality; poverty; lack of access to good education, healthcare, and essential resources; environmental degradation; and economic and political uncertainty becoming integral threads in our social fabric. These challenges are exacerbated by a dearth of leadership at all levels and a shortage of the skills and knowledge required to address them.

The need to develop exceptional people with great skill and ability across a wide range of fields has never been greater. But such individuals must also have compassion, emotional intelligence and a sense of responsibility to their fellow human beings and the planet we all share. Ingrained in them must be the ability to work in concert with people from all walks of life and many beliefs and insights. They must possess the courage to lead and the inner compass to follow the right direction.

St John's College is a proud citizen of Africa and a constituent part of the Anglican Church of the Province of Southern Africa. The school recognises and celebrates the talents that inhere in each of its boys and girls and members of staff. It is a place that seeks to nurture people and engender confidence in them to help them realise their full potential, as is evidenced by the calibre of our Old Johannians and staff and the profound impact they have on society as leaders, experts, activists, philanthropists and civic-minded members of their communities. It is crucial for us to maintain and preserve for future generations the beacon of hope, excellence and faith in the people that St John's represents. Beyond that, it is our urgent responsibility to make St John's accessible to anyone with the potential to thrive here, regardless of their station in life and also to ensure that we are able to maintain and extend our infrastructure to ensure we are fit for purpose.

The generosity of past generations of the Johannian community has made this possible for us and as we launch our Beyond 125 Campaign, we hope that you will bequeath to the school further resources to recharge our Venture of Faith as we pay it forward for generations to come. Lux, Vita, Caritas!



This is the most effective way of "growing our own timber", as well as contributing to the urgent national need for teachers in South Africa.





SCHOLARSHIPS AND BURSARIES

Donating to student **Scholarships and Bursaries** is the most accessible way to make a meaningful difference in a young person's life, with exponential benefits as that person goes on to contribute to society, to support their own families and communities and ultimately, to pay forward the advantage they had through the generous support of others.

It is important that St John's makes every effort to accommodate aspiring young Johannians with exceptional potential, regardless of their financial means. We can do this by awarding partial or full financial support through a bursary or scholarship.

The school has various endowed scholarships and bursary funds that it awards annually to deserving students. The **Centenary Scholarship** is our flagship student support programme. It is one of the most prestigious and generous scholarship programmes in the country and is the most effective way to give a talented young man without the financial means the full experience and benefit of a St John's education.

CENTENARY SCHOLARSHIP

The Centenary Scholarship was introduced in 1998 in order to give meritorious boys from previously disadvantaged communities the opportunity to excel at St John's. The programme guides these young men to be the best that they can be, by providing them with top teaching, coaching and mentoring, and encouraging them to become fully involved in the curriculum of the school. St John's accepts 10 Centenary Scholars into Remove (Grade 8) each year, for a total of 50 students at the College across all five forms. The scholarship is fully inclusive, covering tuition, boarding, uniforms, books and stationery, trips and tours, medical aid, and sports expenses.

This scholarship is truly a life-changing gift for the recipient, as is demonstrated by the exceptional results achieved year after year by our Centenary Scholars and the impressive contributions they have made since leaving school, proving that an excellent education is the best gift you can give, one that will benefit the recipient for the rest of their lives.

The *Beyond 125 Campaign* aims to grow regular annual support, through named scholarships and regular and class-giving initiatives to the value of **R10 million** over the next five years, as well as growing the Student Support Endowment by **R10 million**.



CLASS GIVING FOR STUDENT SUPPORT

One of the most effective ways to support scholarships and bursaries is to coordinate a class-giving initiative.

Perhaps you're grateful for the different ways that St John's opened doors, helped you grow, introduced you to lifelong friends, or allowed you to find your own path. Contributing to, or volunteering to coordinate, your year's classgiving initiative is a meaningful and tangible way to give back. You can give your time, make a contribution, call your friends, send emails, or organise a reunion – there are many ways to make a difference, and lots of flexibility in making your volunteerism fit into your busy schedule. Volunteers are vital to the success of class reunion campaigns. Whether you're able to reach out to hundreds of classmates or just a few close friends, you will renew past friendships and create new bonds.

The power of collective, regular giving through a year group initiative can make a significant difference in the life of a young man, giving him the same opportunity that you were given: the life-long gift of a St John's education.

A group of 50 Old Johannians making an average contribution of R450 each a month can support one full scholarship. Old Johannian class groups making a combined contribution of more than R100,000 annually will be honoured on the *Class Giving Honour Board*.

THE ST JOHN'S COLLEGE ACADEMY

The St John's College Academy is an after-school enrichment programme promoting excellence in Mathematics, Physical Science, English and Life Skills. Started in 2008, the Academy serves boys attending under-resourced schools in our neighbouring communities of Yeoville, Berea and beyond. The academic programme offers after-school supplementary teaching and support on the St John's campus.

Due to the very clear need and the positive impact seen, the Academy grew quickly in its early years to accommodate learners in Grades 10, 11 and 12, for a total of 72 students in the College. In 2019, the programme was extended to include Grades 6 and 7 in the critical preparatory phase. In 2023 the College Academy programme was extended to include a supplementary phase, where Grade 9 students are supported by intern teachers at their own schools. This helps to bridge the gap between the Prep Academy and the College Academy and gives us the opportunity to identify talented students before they enter the programme in Grade 10.

Recently, additional funding has allowed St John's to introduce and integrate a range of sporting and cultural activities and other valuable experiences, all key to a holistic education. Included is a 'learn to swim' programme and a leadership camp.

BEYOND 125 REMAINING TARGET R10 MILLION

The St John's College Academy is well supported by Trusts and Foundations and Corporate Social Investment funds, which cover most of the annual operational costs of the programme.

The *Beyond 125 Campaign* aims to raise **R15 million** towards supporting the Academy and a Sustainability Fund to allow the programme to grow.



TEACHER INTERNSHIP PROGRAMME

In the words of Nelson Mandela, "Education is the most powerful weapon which you can use to change the world." With that belief, we started the St John's College Internship programme in 2007, which runs from Pre-Prep through to the College. Although the different sectors of the school necessitate different requirements for admission onto the programme, the goal is universal: to ensure that prospective teachers are afforded unparalleled experience whilst they train to become teachers.


St John's supports the interns on various levels, including university fees, stipends, books, accommodation, and most importantly, relevant and practical teaching experience. The intention of this project is to shape confident, inspired and inspiring teachers who will pass the gift of quality education on to future generations. A single teacher touches the lives of many, and the effect is exponential.

With many qualified teachers leaving the country and transformation in the teaching profession a priority, it is crucial for us to "grow our own timber" as we consider our long-term plans to retain and develop the kind of excellent teachers that define St John's. An intensive and effective internship programme is essential for us to achieve this. It is our goal to spend the next three years significantly stepping up the teacher internship programme and integrating it across the Pre-Prep, Prep and College.

The St John's College Teacher Internship Programme is supported by Trusts and Foundations and Corporate Social Investment initiatives, and it is our intention to increase this support as the programme grows.

The *Beyond 125 Campaign* aims to raise **R15 million** to develop the programme significantly over the next five years.

BUILDING THE SCHOOL OF TOMORROW

Among the most notable features of St John's are its magnificent grounds, world-class facilities and iconic buildings. In addition to maintaining the historic buildings that are our heritage – for the benefit of our students and to maintain our position as one of the top schools in the country - it is vital that we continue to invest in capital development and modern spaces on the school grounds.

Sports and culture are as important to the education and development of the students as the academic curriculum. Investment in facilities that support this side of their school lives is imperative for us to develop young men and women rightly trained in body, mind and spirit.

As we face the challenges of today, it is helpful to look back to what we have overcome through the decades, including world wars, recessions, social and political uncertainty. Some of the College's most significant capital development took place during these times. Our predecessors looked forward with faith to a school that would stand for centuries to come, and so must we.

We are extremely grateful to our donors who support our capital projects. This support makes it possible for the school to balance the need for both development of facilities to maintain our claim of excellence, and the need to make the school more sustainable.

The magnificent new Aquatics Centre was the first capital project under the banner of the *Beyond 125 Campaign*, and the launch of the Centre in early 2023 was a fitting start to our ambitious plans to ensure that St John's College not only survives but thrives through these difficult times.

We were overwhelmed by the generosity and support of the water polo community in their support of this initiative. In just one year, we raised an incredible R10 million towards the long-anticipated facility, with the unwavering support of parents through their time, effort, skills and donations.

The New Aquatics Centre confirms St John's as one of the leading schools in South Africa, and indeed the world. Our first-class facilities offer unmatched opportunities for the students to make the most of their talents, pursue their passions, develop skills in team-work and leadership and make friendships that will last a lifetime.




MUSIC CENTRE

Over 125 years St John's College has acquired a reputation as a school of excellence for music. The music department has grown significantly in the last decade, putting considerable strain on the present facilities. The department serves the entire campus and provides individual weekly instrumental and vocal lessons for more than 500 students.

A redesigned venue is needed for Drama, Art and Music – with the space to move and make a noise – and a modern, technologically advanced learning environment for music. The new Music Centre will include added individual teaching spaces, ensemble spaces and a magnificent performance venue of an international standard, which will host a symphony orchestra, choir, drama productions, as well as providing a regular meeting space for the Preparatory School.

The Centre is part of the long-term Infrastructure plan for the College, but sufficient donor commitment will enable us to accelerate the launch of this long-awaited project.





MULTI-PURPOSE INDOOR BASKETBALL FACILITY

Basketball at St John's College has been an extraordinary success story and is one of the key focus areas for growth and development at St John's in the coming years. It is the fastest-growing sport at the College, and we are already showing impressive results and establishing ourselves as a leader in the sport through hosting the enormously successful annual basketball tournament.


The passion among the growing community of boys playing basketball and their parents are equal to the energy and excitement of the sport itself. St John's is committed to matching this energy and helping to grow basketball through an ambitious capital project.

The Multi-Purpose Indoor Basketball Facility will bring St John's Basketball into the 21st century. The proposed facility will comprise four undercover courts with grandstands to accommodate a maximum number of spectators. It will increase practice and competition time by providing shelter from summer thunderstorms and be a world-class facility for hosting tournaments.

As St John's grows in size, there is an increasingly pressing need for a multi-purpose space that will serve as a venue for functions, prize-giving, matric farewells, exams, assemblies and performances. The Multi-purpose Indoor Basketball Facility will be designed and constructed with this in mind and will become a central point for the entire St John's Community to come together.

The Multi-purpose Indoor Basketball Facility is part of the long-term Infrastructure plan for the College, but sufficient donor commitment will enable us to accelerate the launch of this exciting and much-anticipated project.

The proceeds from this Endowment allow the Foundation to issue grants to St John's according to the greatest needs or best opportunities for the College at the time.


For a gift to the value of R6 million we will set up a special fund in your name, in the name of your family, class group or business, anonymously or in honour of any person you choose. This fund will be ringfenced within the Endowment investment portfolio. You can give cash, stocks, real estate, or other assets. (Ask us about options for making gifts over time that add up to this minimum amount).

You can specify how you would like the proceeds of the fund to be allocated, for example: a named scholarship; general student support; discretionary funding; infrastructure; or community engagement projects. The principal amount of your fund is never spent, and it can grow over time to generate an increasing stream of funding devoted to your specific interest.
